What does the Catechism of the Catholic Church have to say about A Life Worth Living?

Read lines 26 - 30 and 44 - 49

From the Psalms to the Second Vatican Council to the St. Augustine's Confessions, the Catechism of the Catholic Church lends great wisdom to the pursuit of a life worth living.

Beginning with mere words, our profession of faith speaks to more than just our own beliefs but to the essence of God's love for us. In PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH, SECTION ONE: "I BELIEVE" - "WE BELIEVE" line 26 we learn the simplicity of the ultimate meaning of life.

In CHAPTER ONE: MAN'S CAPACITY FOR GOD section I. THE DESIRE FOR GOD, line 27 we learn that our desire for God is more than intellectual. And, at the same time, God is desirous of us and is always pursuing us (line30). Finally, the In Brief section makes reference to living a full life, in the fullness of your nature and vocation.
